Slimbridge Primary School Policy for Pupil Premium March 2021

Our vision

Our school strives to create a learning environment where everyone has the opportunity to succeed and thrive. The targeted and strategic use of pupil premium will support us in achieving this vision.

Principles

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources may mean that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at any one time.

Provision

- The range of provision the Governors may consider making could include:
 - Reducing class sizes thus improving opportunities for effective AfL and accelerating progress
 - Providing small group work with an experienced teacher focussed on overcoming gaps in learning
 - 1-1 support
 - additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through learning mentors, trained TAs or external agencies
 - Providing emotional and social development support through the THRIVE programme
- All our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress and moving children to at least age related expectations. Initially this will be in reading, speaking and listening, English and maths
- Pupil premium resources may also be used to target higher attaining children on FSM to achieve GDS
- Provision will not be aimed at children with EHCPs or those on My Plan+
- Increasing children's self-esteem has a positive impact on children's lives and their ability to learn. We offer all PP children the chance to learn a musical instrument and showcase their ability in assemblies and events, as a way of increasing their confidence.

Reporting

- It will be the responsibility of the Headteacher, or a delegated member of staff, to produce regular reports for the Governors on:
 - the progress made towards narrowing the gap, by year group, for socially disadvantaged pupils
 - an outline of the provision that was made since the last report

- an evaluation of the cost effectiveness, in terms of the progress made by the pupils receiving a particular provision, when compared with other forms of support.
- The Governors of the school will ensure that there is an annual statement to parents on how the Pupil Premium funding has been used to address the issue of 'narrowing the gap' for socially disadvantaged pupils. This task will be carried out within the requirements published by the Department for Education

Appeal

Any appeals against this policy will be through the governor's complaints procedure.
